RULES AND REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are required by DEFRA to carry with them Official Identity Documents for all horses/ponies when competing or travelling. Competitors are reminded that it is a DEFRA requirement that the Official Identity Documents must be in the name of the legal owner within 30 days of ownership. This must be registered with the breed society, relevant studbook or ID issuing agency, dependant on breed/type of animal. Spot checks may be carried out at qualifying shows and by breed societies.

- HAT RULES-It is strongly recommended that competitors aged 18 or over wear a skull cap or hat with safety harness according to the current approved BSI or European standard in order to minimise risk of head injury when mounted. It is mandatory for competitors under the age of 18 to wear such skull caps or hats.
- Please note that there is no change in relation to the headwear for competitors in the jumping phase of working hunter and ridden sport horse classes where competitors MUST wear a skull cap or hat and safety harness in accordance with the current approved BSI or European standard. Rules as of 1Jan 2026.
- The Organisers of this show have taken reasonable precaution to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organisers and all the Officials and Stewards.

- A special rosette will be presented by SHB in the North West to the highest placed mare in all SHB(GB) ridden classes.

IRISH DRAUGHT

Judge: Mr S Ashton

The following classes are affiliated to the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) and only horses registered with or overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and in the correct ownership are eligible for entry. All Pure Bred Breeding and Youngstock In-hand exhibits must be the progeny of a Graded Mare (ID Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB), AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) and be by a Class 1, Class 2 or RID (GB) stallion on the Irish Draught Breed Register.

Owners of both pure and part bred Irish Draught must be full members of the IDHS(GB). Registration numbers to be stated on the entry form and entries will be sent to the IDHS (GB) prior to the Show to confirm eligibility.

This show is a qualifier for The Irish Draught Owners & Breeders Group Youngstock Challenge. The two highest placed Irish Draught Pure-breds from each age group in Classes 13-15 will qualify. If one or both have already qualified, the horse next in line in each age group will qualify. Horses entered into this class must be eligible under the criteria listed above of this schedule. In the final, will be three preliminary classes with the two highest placed semi finalists from each class going forward to the Championship. The Champion will receive £500 and the Reserve Champion £150.

CLASS 11 IRISH DRAUGHT & ID SPORT HORSE BROOD MARE Graded* mare, 3 yrs old and over, with own foal at foot, or 4 yrs old and over, barren or in foal, **OR** mare, 4 yrs old and over, barren, in foal or with own foal at foot, registered on the Irish Draught Breed Register or ID Sport Horse Registers

CLASS 12 IRISH DRAUGHT & ID SPORT HORSE FOAL - eligible for Class 1 on the Irish Draught Breed Register, or eligible for the ID Sport Horse Registers.

CLASS 13 IRISH DRAUGHT & ID SPORT HORSE YEARLING - filly, colt or gelding, by an RID (GB), ID Class 1 or ID Class 2 sire out of a Graded* dam, **or** filly, colt or gelding, registered on the Irish Draught Breed Register or ID Sport Horse Registers.

CLASS 14 IRISH DRAUGHT & ID SPORT HORSE TWO YEAR OLD- filly, colt or gelding by an RID (GB), ID Class 1 or ID Class 2 sire out of a Graded* dam, **or** filly, colt or gelding registered on the Irish Draught Breed Register or ID Sport Horse Registers.

CLASS 15 IRISH DRAUGHT & ID SPORT HORSE THREE YEAR OLD - filly, colt or gelding by an RID (GB), ID Class 1 or ID Class 2 sire out of a Graded* dam, on the Irish Draught Breed Register or the ID Sport Horse Registers (NB: three old colts must be **un-inspected**).

In Hand Hunter Championship

The Price Family Supreme In Hand Championship is a qualifier for the HOYS PRICE FAMILY SUPREME IN HAND HORSE OF THE YEAR SEMI-FINAL

Champions. from classes 1-5, 6-10, 11-15 & 16-20
will go forward on completion of all In Hand Championships in both rings.

Judge – to be announced on the day

The above championship is a qualifier for the Price Family Supreme In-Hand Semi Final at the National Pony Society Great British In-Hand Show, 13th September 2026 at Vale View Equestrian Centre which is a qualifier for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, 7th – 11th October 2026. The objective of the competition is to find the supreme light horse or pony in hand champion of the year, irrespective of breed or type (excluding heavy horses).

The Champion horse or pony from the above classes will be eligible to compete in the Price Family Supreme In Hand Semi Final, provided it has not already won a Supreme In-Hand qualifier in 2026. If the Champion has already qualified for Horse of the Year Show 2026 or is ineligible, then the Reserve Champion may come forward to The NPS Great British In-Hand Show, provided it has not already qualified and is eligible. If both Champion and Reserve Champion have already qualified for Horse of the Year Show 2025 or are ineligible, then the Semi-Final will not be represented at the NPS Great British In-Hand Show. Foal champions and geldings four years old and over are not eligible to compete or eligible to qualify for Horse of the Year Show. In the event of a horse/pony having been awarded more than one section Championship at this show, that horse/pony will represent both/all sections and the Semi-Final qualification will not pass down to the Reserve Champion in the 2nd and any subsequent sections. All classes are open to Yearlings, 2-year-olds, 3-year-olds, Stallions, broodmares, and barren mares only. Broodmares must be with foal at foot or a relevant certificate of pregnancy. Mares which have not yet foaled or that have lost their foals are eligible to enter with a relevant certificate of pregnancy for the following year. There will be no direct entry into the Supreme In-Hand Championship Semi Final, all animals must be a section champion or reserve champion.

CLASSES 4 & 16

SHB (GB) will award a Mare Premium to the highest placed eligible mare in classes 4 & 16

The Society SHB (GB) offers Brood Mare Premiums at selected shows, but premiums will only be awarded if there are a minimum of three mares forward per class. The premium takes the form of a Service Voucher, the value of which is £100, awarded at the Judge's discretion to their selection from the monetary prize winners, to be used towards the cost of covering the mare by any SHB (GB) Graded Stallion or Life Approved Premium Stallion that is properly registered for the year of covering. The Service Voucher must be used in either of the two years following the year of that award. The owner must be, or become, a fully paid-up member of SHB(GB) to be eligible for the award. No mare shall take more than one award per year. NOTE: Grade I and II mares are eligible to be transferred into the SHB (GB) Stud Book.

SHB (GB) in the NW will award a Mare Premium to the highest placed eligible mare in classes 4,9,11 & 16

Points to be awarded towards the Gilbertson Trophy. - in Hand points competition

In Hand Hunter, Sport Horses, Light Horses, and Irish Draught are included in this competition. Points will be awarded to 1-4th places in each class.

The Gilbertson Trophy will be awarded to the horse attaining the highest number of points overall at the end of the year.

ALL RIDDEN CLASSES WILL BE HELD IN THE MAIN ARENA

Starting at 8.00am

The arena will be open from 7am until 7.45am for warming up.

There will be a 'holding area' near the main door for use until the in hand section is finished in the Small Arena.

RIHS OPEN HACK, COB, MAXI COB, RIDING HORSE

Held under the rules of the British Show Horse Association. Horses must be registered with the Association and all Owners, Exhibitors Producers and Riders and must be Association Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry form.

Classes 22,23,29,30,31 34&35 are qualifiers for The Royal International Horse Show. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward, except for BSHA shows, where qualification will go down the line.

Horses competing at the RIHS and qualifying shows in Hunter sections of The Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain at their Affiliated Shows cannot compete in Hack, Cob, and Riding Horse classes at the same show and vice versa. This does not apply to SHB (GB) Ridden Sport Horse classes.

The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Champion rosette for each section (except for Open Working Show Horse, Ladies Show Horse, Racehorse to Show Horse & HOYS Hunter classes tbc)..

BSHA CLASSIC OF YEAR FINALS

The highest placed unqualified exhibit in the top 5 in each Open Affiliated class (Hack, Cob, Maxi Cob, Riding Horse) will qualify to compete in the BSHA Classic of Year Finals. The Finals will be held at the BSHA National Championship Shows in September 2026.

RIHS AMATEUR QUALIFYING CLASSES

Classes 24,25,26 & 27 are qualifiers for the Amateur Championships at The Royal International Horse Show. The highest placed unqualified horse in each section in each class in the Hack, Cob and Riding Horse classes will qualify for the RIHS Amateur final, with the two highest placed unqualified horses qualifying in the Maxi Cob class.

The BSHA offer a Champion rosette to be awarded in the separate Amateur Championship.

Please refer to rule 6A-C in the 2026 BSHA Rulebook.

The Amateur qualifying classes may be entered on a day ticket, but appropriate membership and horse registration must be applied for within 14 days of the qualifier to confirm qualification.

Horses competing as four- and five-year-olds in BSHA classes, will retain Novice status, irrespective of any wins, placings or prize money accrued, unless they have been placed 1st – 5th at HOYS or RIHS in any OPEN Ridden class (with the exception of the Search for A Star Finals). Horses competing as a six year old or over, in BSHA classes, will retain Novice status unless they have been placed 1st – 5th at HOYS or RIHS in any OPEN Ridden class, BSHA or otherwise, (with the exception of the Search For A Star Finals) or have won a first prize of £25 or over in any showing class, excluding Working Show Horse Classes, Rising Star classes and finals, Ladies Show Horse or In-Hand classes, that were Affiliated to the Association, at home or abroad, prior to 1st January in the current year. Winnings as a four-year-old are exempt. If a horse changes category (ie from a Hack to a Riding Horse or vice versa), it may not revert to a Novice. Snaffle bridles may be worn for Novice classes. Novice animals must be Registered with the Association or Exhibitors must have purchased a RIDING HORSE: Horses competing as four- and five-year-olds in BSHA classes, will retain Novice status, irrespective of any wins, placings or prize money accrued, unless they have been placed 1st – 5th at HOYS or RIHS in any OPEN Ridden class (with the exception of the Search for A Star Finals). Horses competing as a six year old or over, in BSHA classes, will retain Novice status unless they have been placed 1st – 5th at HOYS or RIHS in any OPEN Ridden class, BSHA or otherwise, (with the exception of the Search For A Star Finals) or have won a first prize of £25 or over in any showing class, excluding Working Show Horse Classes, Rising Star classes and finals, Ladies Show Horse or In-Hand classes, that were Affiliated to the Association, at home or abroad, prior to 1st January in the current year. Winnings as a four-year-old are exempt. If a horse changes category (ie from a Hack to a Riding Horse or vice versa), it may not revert to a Novice. Snaffle bridles may be worn for Novice classes.

IDHS (GB) £2000 Ridden Challenge This show is a qualifier for the IDHS(GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge. The highest placed horses (not already qualified) from each of the following Classes 28-31, 36-37, 38-42, 43-44, 48-50 will qualify for the final of the IDHS (GB) £2,000 Ridden Challenge which will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show on 5th & 6th September at Pickering Grange Equestrian, Pickering Grange Farm, Ellistown, Terrance Road, Coalville, LE67 1EZ.

Open to 4, 5 & 6 year old Mares, Geldings or Stallions. Athletic horses that have conformation, movement, and ability to go to the top of their sphere. Horses and riders **DO NOT** have to registered with SHB(GB). Judges will not ride in these classes

To be shown on the flat, will not be required to jump. Snaffle bridles must be worn as per the rules for British Eventing. Horses will not be ridden by the judge but will be required to give a short individual show of walk, trot & canter of approximately 1 minute, to be awarded marks out of a possible 20 for each pace. Lengthened strides in trot and canter must be shown. All horses are required for a conformation assessment to be awarded marks out of a possible 50. A maximum of 10 marks to be awarded for type and a maximum of 10 marks to be awarded for temperament.

IRISH DRAUGHT RIDDEN CLASSES

This show is a qualifier for the **British Horse Feeds and IDHS (GB) Ridden Championship Series**. The 2 highest-placed horses (not already qualified) from Classes 36 and 37 will qualify for the final to be held at the **Royal International Horse Show Hickstead, on July 25th 2026**. Qualification can be passed to 3rd place if the highest-placed horses have already qualified and if in the opinion of the judges, the exhibit is of sufficient quality. Horses can only qualify once, irrespective of the number of shows entered.

- Purebred Irish Draught horses must be registered with or over stamped by the IDHS (GB).
- Purebred stallions must be the progeny of a graded mare (ID Class 1, ID Class 2, RID, AID, or Supplementary Grade Up) by an ID Class 1, Class 2, RID(GB) stallion and be inspected or over stamped by the IDHS (GB) and classified as ID Class 1, Class 2, or RID(GB).
- Irish Draught Sport Horses and (ID Part bred) horses including stallions must have a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding and must be registered on the Irish Draught Sport Horse Register.
- Owners of Pure Bred Irish Draught and Irish Draught Sport Horses (part bred) must be **FULL members** of the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB).
- **N.B. Stallions MUST** be ridden and handled by an experienced person over the age of 18 and identified by a red, white and blue tail ribbon.
- All horses must be in the correct ownership and must be 4 years and over and 153cm (15hh) or over

These classes are qualifiers for The Agra Royal International Horse Show. The two highest placed horses will qualify, no horse lower than 2nd will qualify. In working hunter classes the two highest placed horses from each class will go through to the Working Hunter Championship and all these four horses will qualify for RIHS if they have not already done so. RIHS Qualification will not pass down the line beyond the aforementioned placings. In the Working Hunter Championship judges must place all horses to determine qualification.

Only horses registered with SHB (GB) and who are also registered on the current year's Show Hunter Register are eligible to enter in Qualifying Classes for RIHS Ridden and Working Hunter Championships and the Show Hunter Registration Number must be quoted on entries. Any horse that is entered for a Qualifying Class without first being on the Show Hunter Register cannot subsequently be registered and therefore will not be eligible for entry in that class on the day and will be disqualified if forward.

DAY TICKETS - Competitors may compete on a day ticket and may have a maximum of two Day Tickets per season. Each day ticket is valid for the entirety of the show (this covers all SHB(GB) Classes that require a membership and registration) and it covers owner and rider membership together with horse registration/over-stamp for that show. As a qualifying class for RIHS in order for the qualification to be valid, application for full owner/rider membership and horse registration/ over-stamp must be received in the SHB(GB) office within 14 days.

These classes are also qualifying classes for the SHB(GB) SUPREME RIDDEN HUNTER CHAMPIONSHIP to be held at The National Supreme Hunter Championship 11th-13th August 2026. Horses placed 1st to 3rd in each section will qualify

CLASS 38 OPEN NOVICE HUNTER mare or gelding, four years old or over exceeding

148cms..not having won a first prize of £25 or a total of £150 (or equivalent values) in prize money (including championship prize money) in any SHB(GB) affiliated Ridden Hunter Classes at home or abroad, before 1st January in the current year, excepting all prize money awarded as a four-year-old. 4-year-olds will be ridden by a ride judge in these classes. An SHB(GB) special award will be made to the highest placed 4 year old in a Novice class.

CLASS 39 RIHS LIGHTWEIGHT HUNTER, mare or gelding
four years old or over, to carry up to 12 stone 7lbs.

CLASS 40 RIHS MIDDLEWEIGHT HUNTER, mare or gelding, four years old or over, to carry over 12 stone 7lbs and up to 14 stone.

four years old or over, to carry over 14 stone.

CLASS 42 RIHS SMALL HUNTER, Any mare or gelding, 4 years old or over exceeding 148 cm (14.2hh approx.) but not exceeding 158 cm (15.2hh approx.). A horse, which is registered as a Small Hunter, cannot compete in an Open Weight Class. Animals in ridden height restricted classes WILL NOT be required to be in possession of a JMB Height Certificate or verification of measurement to compete in RIHS or HOYS Qualifiers. However qualifying animals will need to be measured within 28 days of qualification or before the final, whichever is sooner. Class 47 is a qualifier for the Open Working Show Horse Championship at The AgricRoyal International Horse Show

For the RIHS qualification, the winner, if not already qualified in the Working Show Horse class will qualify. If the first has already qualified, the qualification may pass down to no lower than fifth place. For the SEIB Working Show Horse qualification, the two highest placed unqualified in the top 5 will qualify.

Open **ONLY** to Hacks, Cobs, Maxi Cobs and Riding Horses, mare or gelding four years old and over, exceeding 148cms. This class is **NOT** open to Hunters, ie those horses registered and competing as a hunter or working hunter with BSHA, Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain or The Showing Register for the current season.

Please refer to rule 12(iv)(i) in the 2025 BSHA Rulebook.

The Working Show Horse qualifying classes may be entered on a day ticket, but appropriate membership and horse registration must be applied for within 14 days of the qualifier to confirm qualification.

Any Horse which is a Grade B Showjumper, Intermediate Eventer, or above, as at the 1st of January of the current year, is not eligible to compete in any Working Show Horse class.

A Rider may ride up to two Horses in the jumping phase but must then select one Horse to take through to the Ride and Conformation phases (if required). No change of Rider is allowed.

Class 50 are For Working Hunters, any weight, mares, geldings or stallions (competing stallions must have a red, white and blue ribbon displayed in their tail) four years old or over, exceeding 148cm, to be ridden.

All owners, riders & producers to be members of SHB, BSHA or TSR Horses must be registered with SHB, BSHA or TSR. Any horse which has qualified as a Grade A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as of 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter classes. Fences will not exceed 1.14m (3ft 9ins) in height; there should be a minimum of 8 fences and a maximum of 12 fences. The Course must contain a combination and should contain a water tray.

These classes will be judged in two parts.

Part One (Jumping) will be judged first, without a jump-off. All clear rounds and any other horses the judges may require will go forward to the next part. A rider can ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then must select only one horse to take forward into the ride and conformation if so required (no change of rider is allowed). marks will be awarded in the following way:

Marks must be awarded in the following way:

PHASE I (60 MARKS)

A: JUMPING POINTS 40 MARKS

B: STYLE WHILE JUMPING 20 MARKS

PHASE II (40 MARKS)

C: CONFORMATION 20 MARKS

D: RIDE 20 MARKS

In the event of equality the CONFORMATION MARK from Phase II will take precedence, followed by the RIDE MARK, and then the STYLE MARK. category.

This class is a qualifying class for Horse of the Year Show, NEC, Birmingham, 7th - 11th October 2025. Qualification will not pass below 3rd place, with the exception of the BSHA National Championship show. Qualification will be verified by the Horse of the Year Show
